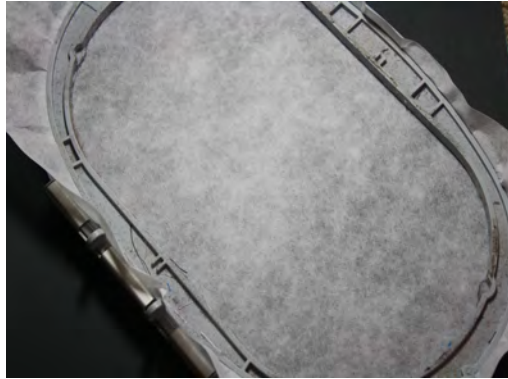


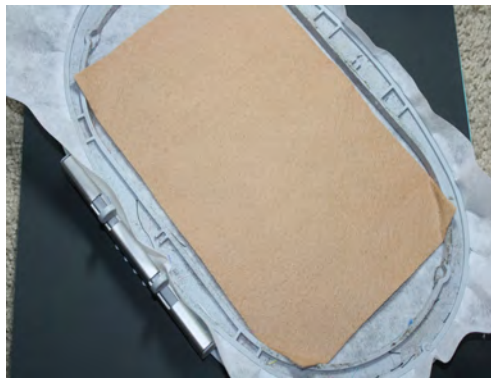
# **Clock Tutorial**

## **Dejah Vue Designs**

Start by hooping your stabilizer. I prefer tear away, but others can be used.



Add your choice of felt to the hoop. 505 or other spray can be used to adhere the felt to the stabilizer



Start by stitching step 1 of the clock body file onto your felt. It will stitch a circle on your felt





Next stitch step 2 of the clock body file. It will stitch the numbers 1-12 on your felt



Next stitch step 3 of the clock body file. This will stitch a circle as a guide for attaching a button later in the assembly process



Take your hoop off your machine.



Spray with 505 or other spray and attach another piece of felt to the back of your hoop.

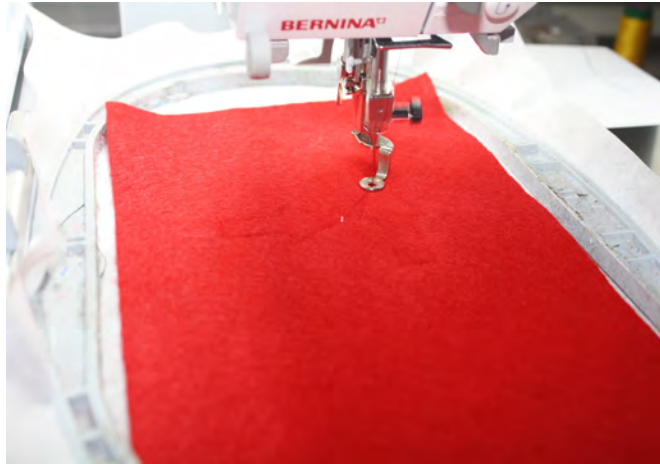


Re-attach hoop to machine and stitch step 4 of the clock body file. This will secure the bottom felt to the rest of the clock around the circle edge.

You have completed the clock body. Let's begin the clock hands.



Hoop stabilizer as before, but add felt to BOTH front and back of hoop with 505 or other spray.



Stitch step 1 of the clock hand file. This is the only step and once complete you have completed the clock hands.



Cut clock face and clock hands out of felt so you have pieces ready to assemble. On the clock hands hole punch or cut slits into both clock hands.



Begin assembly by poking threaded needle through the back of the clock to the front.





Add clock hands, making sure that the needle goes through the holes in the hands and does not enter any felt.



Add button and bring needle through all layers (double check that you have not caught any felt from the 2 clock hands)



Continue securing the button by going back and forth between holes to make an X securing the button. It is VERY important that you do not catch the felt from either clock hand and keep the needle passing through the holes you punched/slit earlier. This is what allows your hands to move.

You have finished your clock and it is ready to help teach someone to tell time!
