



Police Box Phone Case & Device Case

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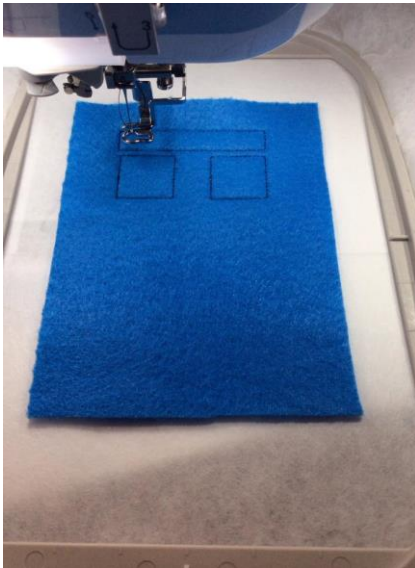
**Hoop your stabilizer (I use tear away)  
and stitch the placement line.**



**Lay your felt down for the phone booth.  
This will be your main piece of felt.**



**Run the placement lines for the top 3 boxes.**



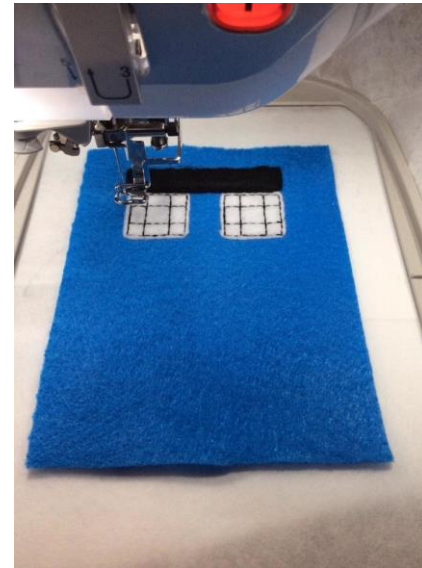
**Stitch the window details.**



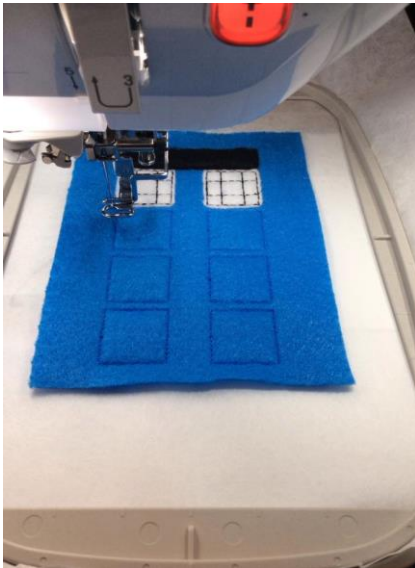
**Run the tack down stitch for the 2 larger windows and only trim around the stitched area. When finished, it will look like the picture below.**



**Run the tack down stitch for the top box and only trim around the stitched area. When finished, it will look like the picture below.**



**Stitch the placement line for the lower 6 windows. If you would like to make the windows a different color felt, lay that felt down now.**



**Stitch the tack down line for the windows.**



**Stitch the words Police Box.**



**Remove the hoop from your machine without unhooping your project. Put a full piece of felt the size of your placement line (this varies depending on the size of the device you're making the cover for) over placement line and another piece  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch below the placement line.**





**Put the hoop back onto your machine and finish up the final steps.**



**This is what the case will look like when complete. Trim  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch from the edges and you're done!**
